LOCATION: Residential base on Nonsuch Island, Castle Harbour, with field trips to locations including Walsingham Nature Reserve, Spittal Pond, Paget Marsh, Hungry Bay, North Rock and Harrington Sound.

AVAILABILITY: There are 14 vacancies for students ages 15 to 18
(must be 15 years old by 1st January 2016)

GOAL: The goal of this one-week camp is to provide students with an awareness of the uniqueness and fragility of Bermuda's biodiversity, and foster an active and life-long interest in the natural environment. The course includes an introduction to scientific fieldwork, designed to help students make future course and career choices.

SELECTION: Representation from Bermuda's public and private schools is expected. Both enthusiasm for science and the environment and academic capability will be taken into account. Final selection is made by the Nonsuch Camp Committee based on the student's written application and his/her teacher's recommendation. The camp curriculum is physically and academically challenging. Please advise if you have any physical limitations involving walking, snorkelling or swimming, or academic challenges such as ADHD or a learning disability, so that counsellors can be prepared to assist.
