The first **Roseate Tern nesting** since the 1840s took place on our Pearl Island Reserve.



Audubon members inspired children's interest in birds at **Bermuda National Trust's Children's Walk** at Spittal Pond.





As part of the Tern Recovery Project, Erich Hetzel imported and installed **decoys** to encourage tern nesting on Pearl Island.






#### Cahows
