1 General

The Bermuda Audubon Society (the "Society") was established in 1954 with the following objectives:
a) to arouse through education public recognition of the value of and need for protecting
wild birds and animals, plants, soil and water, as well as the interdependence of these natural resources;
b) to cooperate, as occasion prompts, with conservation agencies and with private associations
devoted to the interests of conservation and to education in the field of natural resources; and
c) to engage in such educational, scientific, literary, historical, philanthropic and charitable pursuits as
may be a part of the aforementioned objectives.

The Society is an active advocate for Bermuda's natural environment, with special attention to bird life, and its main activities include the acquisition and management of land as nature reserves, Bluebird education an annual Nonsuch Island Natural History camp for 15-18 year olds, an annual bird camp and Bluebird nest box construction workshops.

Nature Reserves

The Society owns a number of nature reserves, which are listed on an attached schedule. Over the years the costs were not recorded in the financial statements, but most were donated.

Some years ago the Society entered into a joint venture with The Bermuda National Trust forming "Buy Back Bermuda", which has successfully acquired important areas of interest.

Buy Back Bermuda

In 2004 the Society and The Bermuda National Trust entered into a joint venture initiative, The Buy Back Bermuda Campaign, to acquire and preserve public open space for the benefit of future generations. The Society has not consolidated its 50% share of the balances and transactions relating to this campaign in its financial statements. However the transactions have been audited by the auditors of The Bermuda National Trust, as their share is consolidated in their audited financial statements. At December 31, 2015 the following figures, being the Society's share, are not included in these financial statements:

Alfred Blackburn Smith Reserve Fund

4 The Society received a cash donation in 2014 to be used specifically on the Alfred Blackburn Smith Reserve in Paget. The property is adjacent to the Coral Beach Club. Work on removing invasive trees and shrubs is ongoing.

Investment - Bermuda Community Foundation Endowment Fund

Bermuda Community Foundation had a Matching Funds Program in 2014 and charities were challenged to compete for a \$5,000 match (from RenRe) with the establishment of a \$20,000+ endowment fund. The Society applied and were awarded a grant in early 2015 and so contributed \$20,000 of its funds, for a total of \$25,000. At the end of December 2016 the value of the total fund for the Society was \$25,652 (2015 - \$23,104)

Land Assets

In 2015 an anonymous donor donated 2.50 acres of land at Stokes Point East which enhances the land already owned at Stokes Point. Work is being considered to improve access to the whole property.

Donations received

The donations received during the year included a unsolicited donation of \$50,000, of which \$5,000 is to be used to improve the property at Paget Marsh.
