



The Bermuda Audubon Society held its 35th CBC on 31st December.

Features of this year's count included:

- 8,682 individual birds were counted (very similar to last year's total)
- 100 species of birds 96 (2008), 95 (2007), 100 (2006)
- 1 new species for count day (Western Kingbird)
- ·House Sparrow was the most common species (20% of the count)
- Nearly 250 species have now been record on the CBC in Bermuda since 1975
