



Call















Habitat: Open country around trees. Found around agricultural fields, golf courses, parks, backyards, and cemeteries.

Food: Mostly insects, wild fruit and berries. Occasionally, larger prey items such as lizards and tree frogs.

Nest: Cavity nesters. Almost entirely dependent on man-made nest boxes.

Behavior: Typically perches on wires, fence posts or branches.

Swoops to ground to catch prey but may occasionally catch insects in mid-air.








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
1870s - Introduction of House Sparrow


1940s - Cedar Scale Imported





Types of Nest Boxes














Features of Nest Box



Exactly 1.5 inch opening NO perch Roof with overhang for shade Ventilation spaces beneath roof 4 inch square base Drainage holes in base 8 inch deep Stairs below opening Hinge to open box Unpainted or pale pastel colours

Location of Nest Box



5 feet off the ground Open grassy field Away from overhanging trees Mount on free standing pole In vicinity of suitable perch sites Consider wind direction **Avoid Pesticide Use** Bermuda Bluebird Society can help

Nest Building

Egg Laying 1 per day, 4-6 eggs

4-5 days

Egg Incubation 12-14 days

Stop Opening Box 12-14 days

Time to Fledge 15-18 days

Feeding by Parents 21 days

Nest Box Management



Once per week once box is up Twice per week after 1st egg

Remove Sparrow Nests

Remove Broken Eggs or Dead Chicks

Observe for Mites

Observe Health of Chicks

What to do about Sparrows

Passive


Placement away from dense houses and buildings
Discourage Sparrows in Area - No feeders
Set up box at appropriate time
Alternative Nest Box Designs - Gilbertson
Alternative Nest Box Heights

Active

Monitor Regularly and Remove Nests and Remove Nests and Remove Nests and Remove Nests Sparrow Spooker after first egg is laid Monofilament Line near opening Sparrow Traps




